Joanie's workshops focus on teaching a specific technique, with plenty of individualized coaching on the basics used every day. Her goal for machine quilting classes is for each student to take home the confidence in the operation of their machine for the essential free-motion quilting process, teaching the lifelong skills needed to complete your future quilts. Students follow a well written pattern for an original project that is designed specifically to teach each step of a technique without an expectation of prior experience. Students produce items that are beautiful, motivating them to achieve better workmanship.

The first thing she does when arriving in a classroom is to declare it a problem free zone. Any issues that arise are considered an opportunity to learn something new, in a different way. Class time begins with introductory PowerPoint presentation where information is organized efficiently, for all to be able to see clearly. This allows students to relax, focus on the topic and understand the plan for the entire day. They see an illustrated explanation of the concept; learn recommended supplies and the machine set-up. Next, time is spent practicing skill building exercises to gain confidence in a relaxed, non-competitive environment. Each student is coached to adjust their machine for good tension, beyond that, this is not a performance exam, and they may stitch at their own pace. Now they are ready for the project taught step-by-step and repeated as many times as necessary until each person feels ready to move on. Finally, these new skills are *put into action* stitching the beautiful project and sharing their thoughts as they learn the process.

After teaching professionally for many years, Joanie has a pretty clear vision of the needs of students. She has chosen the best supplies to get the job successfully. Having tested products for years, Joanie will instruct how they are used and why she considers them to be the best choice. Most workshops require very little prep; rather, a kit is assembled to assure that every student has exactly the supplies required. This avoids any struggle to purchase difficult to find products, assuring that class time is not wasted on unprepared supplies. With everything there ready and waiting, students can relax knowing their job is to listen and follow the suggestions for success. Providing kits also works to the advantage of the event coordinator as they encourage last minute sign-ups. 
Everything you ever wanted to know about machine quilting but didn't know who to ask

The tables are pushed to the center of the room, all of the inspiring quilts she has brought for the different presentations are laid out as students gather their chairs in for a really close look.

The quilts are observed one by one and a discussion of how they were made ensues. Joanie's shares the stories behind her quilts that inspired the ideas for conceiving and producing the quilts. She explains how she uses unique graphic images in her work and tells how she had to invent processes unlike traditional methods to create those visions in color using appliqué and illustrations in thread. Joanie's hope is that she will inspire you with her creativity and that you will become intrigued and stretches your imagination to fill empty spaces of your quilts with significant images relevant to your life.
